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OVERVIEW

Mr Scruby has a broad ranging practice with a general focus on equity, commercial, corporations and taxation matters and appears in appellate and trial courts, various tribunals and commissions of inquiry. He was appointed silk in 2017.

Mr Scruby regularly acts in commercial and equity matters, including frequently for directors defending breach of duty claims. He has been briefed for plaintiffs and defendants in relation to a number of major corporate insolvencies, including the Halifax group, the Hastie group Babcock & Brown, BBY Ltd, Courtenay House and MF Global. He has appeared for and against ASIC and the ACCC in various regulatory matters. He appears frequently for the Commissioner of Taxation in various jurisdictions. In 2015 he was counsel assisting the Royal Commission into Trade Union Corruption. He has been briefed for and against mining companies, including Glencore, Rio Tinto and BHP, in relation to royalty and development disputes.

Before coming to the bar, he worked as an associate to Justice Callinan in the High Court of Australia. He has a BCL and MPhil from Oxford University and a BA (hons 1st class and university medal in English) and LLB (hons first class) Sydney University.
